# HIKING/CAMPING/LODGING KHAUDUM & CAPRIVI (NORTH-EAST NAMIBIA) The AREA, the WILDLIFE, the PEOPLE, the WEATHER

- Location and Terrain: Namibia's north-east is a remote paradise for game viewing and birding. Hidden gems like Khaudum National Park remain remote due to the difficulty of accessing this remote area.
- Wildlife Encounters: This area is home to many game species not found in Namibia's drier regions. These include the Sable Antelope, the Roan Antelope, the Cape Buffalo, and many more. In contrast to the rest of Namibia, this area is a lot lusher, with large trees, vegetation, and rivers. This area's beautiful perennial river systems also make this special place a birding hot spot, with well over 400 species of birds in the summer months.
- Cultural Sensitivity: This remote area is also rich in culture, with some of the last remaining San people of Southern Africa. We have a rare opportunity to glimpse into their amazing knowledge of the natural world. The San were the original inhabitants of the area, the first and only people to live in harmony with nature. In Caprivi, most of the tribal people still live a very traditional life of subsistence farming and harvesting fish as a protein source from the river systems.
- Weather Conditions: This is an area where the pace of life is in sync with the cycle of the seasons.

Khaudum National Park in Namibia will offer a raw and untouched wilderness experience. The park offers a wide range of animals. Khaudum is off the beaten track and is also known for its abundant elephant population and rare species like roan antelope and African wild dogs.

This offers a wonderful opportunity to learn about their traditions and amazing bush skills like trapping, harvesting desert plants, hunting, and tracking. After lunch, we head to Tsumkwe, our last fuel stop, before entering Khaudum National Park and heading for the Sikeretti Campsite.

## Sikeretti Camp

The conservation philosophy at Khaudum is based on the idea that supporting rural communities and protecting wildlife go hand in hand.

The Khaudum North Complex Conservancy and the Gciriku Traditional Authority work together to privately operate both camps.

The Sikereti Camp is in a grove of purple-pod-cruster-leave trees. The campsite has its own private washing-up area, hot water showers fired by a donkey, flush toilets, and a central fireplace.

We will embark on early morning and late afternoon game drives, visiting waterholes in the Sikeretti area.

# Shametu River Lodge (Camping)

Spectacular views of the Popa Rapids along the Kavango River

At the Shametu River Lodge, we will set up camp on the banks of the Okavango River to relax and enjoy a sundowner.

During our stay here, we visit Mahango National Park in the morning and Buffalo Core in the afternoon. Canoe or mokoro rides on the river are optional extras (excluded from the price). Shametu is a great spot for fishing, bird watching, boat cruises, and village walks with a beautiful campsite.

Heading east, deeper into Caprivi, we will arrive at the Nambwa Campsite around lunchtime. This campsite is in the heart of the Kavango Zambezi Trans Frontier Conservation Area (KAZA) and is part of the large peace park initiative. The campsite lies beautifully laid out on the banks of the Kwando River, nestled under the canopies of Jackaberry and Mopane trees. Hippos and elephants might walk through the camp, and there are ample opportunities for game spotting and bird watching during game drives in the early morning and late afternoon.
